H.Res. 920 - Remove the name of Richard B. Russell from the Russell Senate Office Building

- This resolution, introduced on February 9th, 2022, calls on the Senate to remove the name of Richard B. Russell from the Russell Senate Office Building.
 - Richard Brevard Russell Jr. was an unapologetic white supremacist.
 - He claimed that America was "a white man's country" and "we are going to keep it that way."
 - During his first run for the state legislature, in 1920, he solicited the support of every white voter and pledged to serve them.
 - He successfully filibustered anti-lynching bills, and also voted against the 1964 Civil Rights Act, which he called "shortsighted and disastrous."
 - He blocked bills to eliminate poll taxes.
 - He co-authored the "Southern Manifesto" to slow the integration of public schools after the Supreme Court unanimously ordered it in Brown v. Board of Education.
 - He was the chief legislative architect of the South's bitter opposition to civil rights.
